REGISTRATION FEES

For each financial year there are 2 potential rates, dependent on which SDR was in force at the time registration payments were calculated

These are broken down into the Current Rate 1 and the Old Rate 2

Only Current Rate figures are further broken down into the age ranges of the patients 3

Current SDR rate Capitation fees are also broken down to show: -

- 41 (a) Basic Fees
- 41 (b) Enhanced Fees where treatment time is at least doubled due to patient's severe mental or physical handicap/learning difficulties
- 41 (c) Enhancement due to the Deprivation Category of the practice postcode

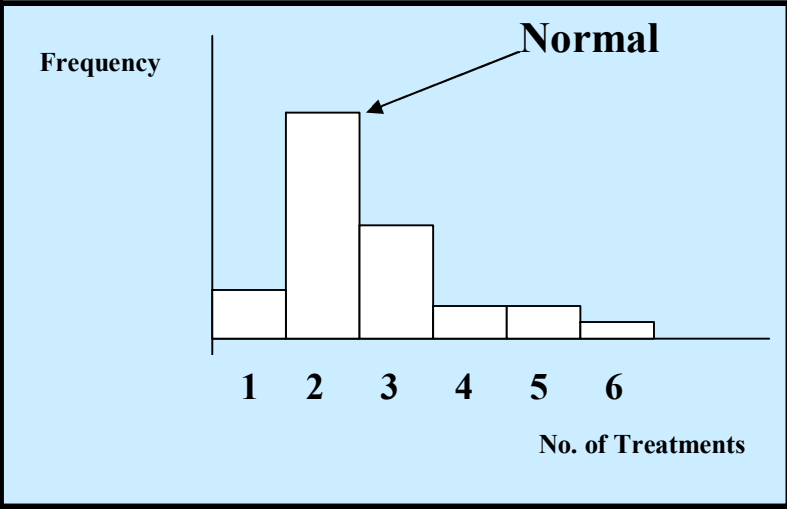
